Late registrations can be made in person by coming to the Administrative Service Center, 215 Pine Avenue East, Menomonie beginning on Tuesday, May 28, and ending on Wednesday, June 5, 2024, during the hours of 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. **Registration is required prior to attendance.** Please do not send your child to summer programming without enrolling your child via **online enrollment**. Contact information, health/medical updates, bus reservations, and class choices all need to be finalized before we place students in classes. There are no registration fees for summer school.

Department Goals

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Learn-to-Swim Course Levels

Parent-Child Toddler (Ages 1-2 Years)

Skills Include: Water adjustment, breath control, supported floats on front and back, kicking, and water games and songs. A parent is **required** to be in the water with their child.

Parent-Child Preschool (Ages 3-5 Years)

Skills include: Water adjournment, safe water entry, breath control, supported floats on front and back, kicking, alternating arm movement on front, bobbing, water safety topics, games, and songs. A parents is **required** to accompany any child enrolled in the parent/preschool class. When a child is safe in the water by him/herself, the parent may be dismissed from going in the water.

Red Cross Level Classes

Level 1

Introduction to Water Skills (Ages 5 & Older)

Skills include: Enter and exit water safely, submerge mouth nose and eyes, exhale under water through mouth and nose, open eyes underwater and pick-up submerged object. Float on front and back, explore arms and hand movements, swim on front and back using arm and leg actions, and follow basic water safety rules and use a life jacket.

Level 2

Fundamentals of Aquatic Skills (Ages 6 & Older)

Prerequisites: Swimmer must have passed Level 1, or be able to perform a front float with face in water, back float, and swim on front and back using arm and leg actions.

Skills include: Enter water by stepping or jumping from the side, exit water from safety ladder, submerge entire head, open eyes under water and pick-up submerged object. Float on front and back, perform front and back glide, roll over from front to back, and back to front. Tread water using arm and leg motions, swim on front and back using combined strokes, swim on side, and move in water while wearing a life jack.

Level 3

Stroke Development

Prerequisites: Swimmer must have passed Level 2, or can float on front and back, swim 15 yards on front and back crawls, using kick and alternating arm movement, and can perform rhythmic breathing.

Skills include: Jump into deep water from side, dive from kneeling and standing position, submerge and retrieve object, bob with head fully submerged. Use rotary breathing in horizontal position, perform front and back glide, perform survival float, change from horizontal to vertical on front and back, perform front and back crawl, butterfly-kick, and body motion. Perform HELP and huddle position. perform reaching assist and use Check-Call-Care in an emergency

Level 4

Stroke Improvement

Prerequisites: Swimmer must have passed Level 3, or can swim 15 yards of coordinated front and back crawls using kick and alternating arm movement, can perform rhythmic breathing, and jump into deep water.

Skills include: Perform shallow water dive, swim underwater, perform feet-first surface dive, perform open turns on front and back using any stroke, and tread water using sculling arm motions and kick. Perform the following strokes: front and back crawl, breaststroke, butterfly, elementary backstroke, and sidestroke. Use of safe diving rules, perform compact jump with lifejacket, and perform throwing assist and care for conscious choking victim.

Level 5

Stroke Refinement

Prerequisites: Must have passed Level 4 or can swim 25 yards back crawl and front crawl, 10 yards of elementary backstroke, breast stroke kick, sidestroke kick, standing dive into pool, and deep water bobbing.

Sills include: Tread water with two different kicks, learn survival swimming, perform rescue breathing, standing dives, pike surface dive, shallow dive two body lengths and begin any front stroke, tuck surface dive, front flip turn, backstroke flip turn, front and back crawl, butterfly, breaststroke, elementary backstroke, sidestroke, and endurance swimming.

Level 6

Swimming & Skill Proficiency

Prerequisites: Must have passed Level 5 or can swim 25 yards breaststroke and sidestroke, 25 yards elementary backstroke, 50 yards front and back crawl, and 15 yard butterfly. Must be able to tread water for 2 minutes, stride jump, and open turns

Refines strokes so students swim them with ease, efficiency, power, and smoothness over great distances. Level 6 is designed with "menu" options. Each of these options focus on preparing students to participate on swim teams and in more advanced courses, such as Water Safety Instructor and Lifeguard Training. These options include"

- Personal Water Safety
- Fundamentals of Diving
- Fitness Swimming
- Lifeguard Readiness

Leads to D.N.R. Certification. State Law: No person under the age of 10 years may operate a motor boat. Persons 10 years but less than 12 years of age may operate a motor boat if accompanied by parent, guardian, or a person at least 18 years of age designated by parents or guardian. Person at least 12 but less than 16 years of age may operate a motor boat only if person 18 years or older designated by parents or guardian or if they have successfully completed a D.N.R. prescribed Boating Safety Course and passes a safety certificate issued by the D.N.R. "A person at least 16 years old may operate a motor boat only if he or she has completed a boating safety course that is accepted by the Wisconsin D.N.R. A person born before January 1, 1989 is exempt from the safety course requirement." Parents or guardian are punishable by law for knowingly allowing unauthorized person to operate a motor boat.

Participants are only allowed to miss **one** class per state rules.

Customer ID # must be given to instructor first day of class.

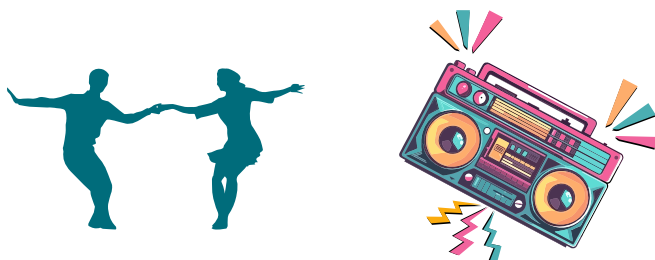

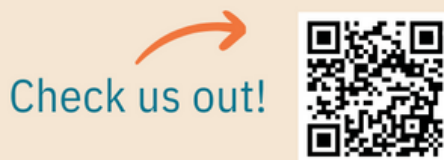

Please recognize the Menomonie Recreation Department does not carry medical accident insurance for facilities. The cost would make programs fees and rental charges prohibitive. Therefore, each person registering themselves or a family should review their Personal Health Insurance policy for coverage.

Most programs require a minimum enrollment based on necessary revenues, before they will be conducted. Cancellations may occur if minimum are not attained. The Department reserves the right to adjust class if necessary, due to enrollment levels, or other circumstances beyond our control.

Contact the Recreation Department to register your interest in new courses. When a sufficient number of individuals are enrolled, a course will be developed at convenient time. Usually six to twelve participants are needed to begin a course at a reasonable cost.

Refunds

Refunds on fees or charges for Recreation Department programs and services will be made under the following conditions

1. **Full Refund:** Will be granted when programs are cancelled, or changed to a date/time which could prevent participation.
2. **A Refund, Less \$5.00 Service Charge:** Will be granted when a person cancels from a program or service at least three business days prior to the scheduled start date of the program or service.
3. **No Refund:** Will be granted when a person cancels from a program or service at least three days prior to the programs or services scheduled start date.

Procedures for Refunds-

1. Request refund from the Recreation Department either in person or in writing.
2. Upon approval, refund can be put back on ActiveNet account, credit/debit card, or check.

PARK & SHELTER RULES

Parks are open from 7a.m. to 10p.m. daily.

Please dump all rubbish and garbage in the dumpster near your site. Do not dump ice on grass, or put grease in dumpsters. Garbage bags are not provided.

Amplified music is permissible at all City Parks from 10:00 a.m.-10:00 p.m. A permit and \$15.00 filing fee required to be filled out with reservation form.

Alcohol is allowed in all parks, except the Leisure Services Center, Fowlers Court, and Wilson Park Bandshell. Alcohol may not be sold in City Parks.

Tents may be installed only in designated areas because of buried underground utilities, with a Community Services employee present.

Arrangements for additional picnic tables and other equipment may be made at an additional cost to the user.

No glass of any kind is allowed in City Parks.

No City facilities may be used for commercial selling purposes. Fundraising for non-profit organizations is allowed when noted on the application.

The City reserves the right to require renters to provide a certificate of insurance which names the City as an Additional Insured, and provides adequate coverage for the type of activity scheduled. Renters agree to hold the City harmless.

The individual listed on the Reservation Request shall be responsible for enforcement of all park rules and proper conduct of all persons using the facilities. Renters are responsible for loss of, damage to, City property under their control and assume the full cost of repair or replacement.

All property belonging to the renter shall be removed from the building at the conclusion of the rental period. No permanent decorations are permitted. No storage of items is permitted.

Community Services Department staff are on duty Monday-Friday from 7:00a.m.-5:00p.m. and on weekends from 7:00-9:00a.m., in case of an emergency contact Community Services Department at 715-232-2302.

There are several shelters that are enclosed and require you to get an access code for entry. The shelter name are Wakanda Pavilion, Northside Shelter, and Wilson Park Restrooms. When using these facilities we advise you to not store products or supplies in them prior to the day of your rental. The week of your rental you will be given the access code for your reservation.

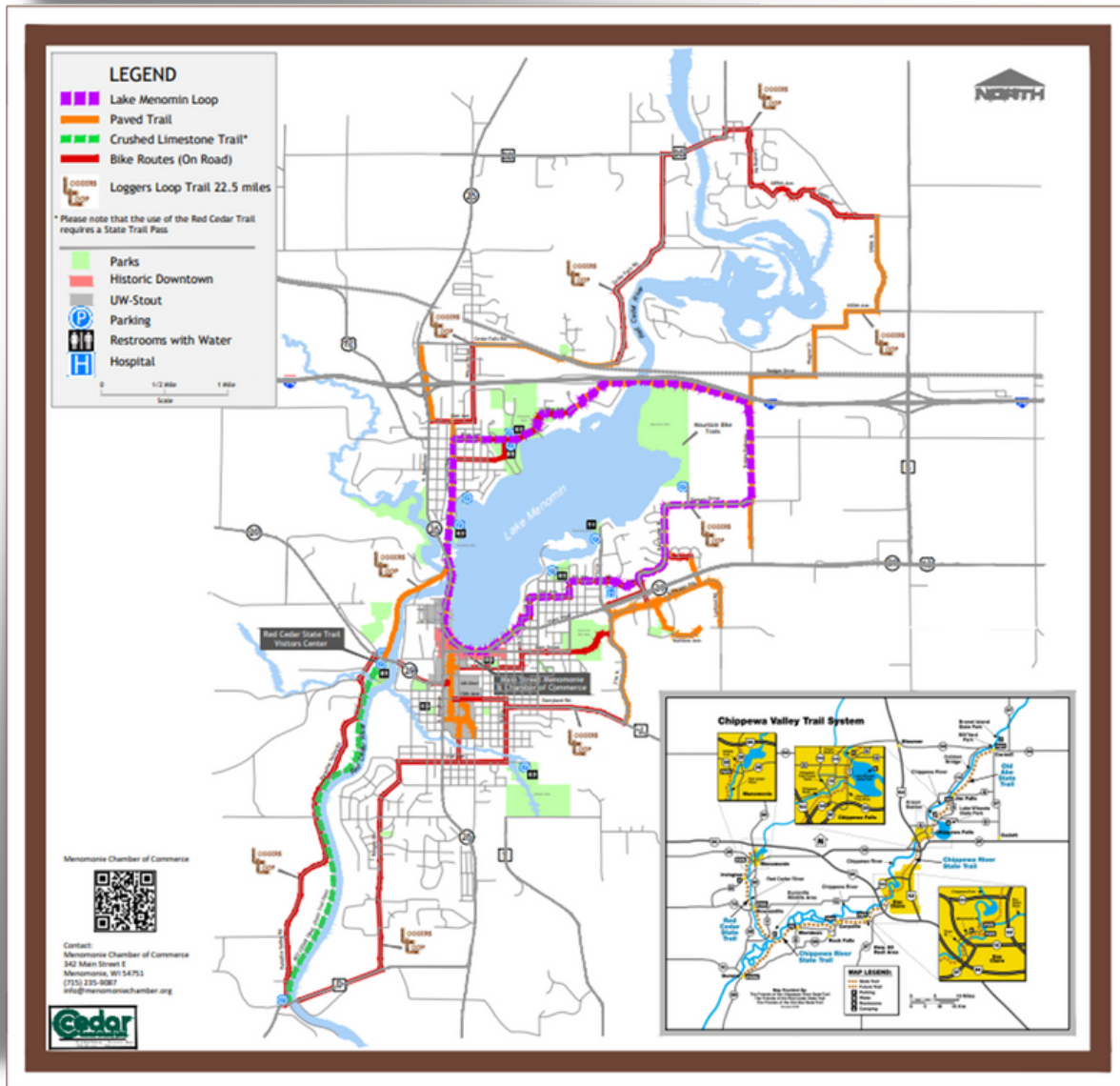

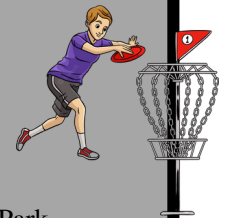
Menomonie Skatepark

(Location Just Off of Brickyard Road -Near the Humane Society)

Welcome to the Menomonie Off Leash Dog Park. This Dog Park was designed and built with the help of local dog enthusiasts. This is your park - Please do your part to maintain it! The Dog Park is open Sunrise to Sunset.

-  All dogs must display valid, city, town, or county license, rabies, and dog park tags.
-  Owners and handlers must be 16 years of age and are liable for damage or injury inflicted by their dog(s).
-  Any children in the dog park under the age of 10 years must be supervised by an adult 18 years of age or older.
-  Limit of 3 dogs per handler. Owners or handlers must be inside the dog park and attentive to their dog(s) at all times.
-  Dogs must be kept on a leash when entering and exiting the park, including the transitional corridor.
-  All dogs in the park must be at least 5 months of age. Carry a leash for each with you at all times.
-  Owners and handlers must "scoop-poop" and dispose of it in the trash receptacle.
-  Alcohol, glass, or metal containers are not allowed in the park.
-  Owners or handlers with dogs exhibiting aggressive behavior must "leash up or leave" immediately.
-  Female dogs while in heat are not allowed in the park.

Career sectors focused on Healthcare, Manufacturing, Customer Service, Information Technology, Customer Service, and Hospitality. Get the knowledge to make an informed career choice. Students will participate in hands-on activities and go on tours related to each career field.

Job Tours:

Students assigned up to three accompanied job tours in interested career fields. Job touring is a career exploration activity, designed to increase an individual's awareness of employment options. Takes place in an integrated, community-based work environment and classroom setting.

Learning2Earn:

This is a great opportunity to learn about local careers, gain a better understanding of life choices and earn a wage working in your community. Explore your interests, talents, and strengths. Learn how to be independent and successful on the job. With emphasis on soft skills, interpersonal skills, time management and responsibility, you will feel confident in your first job.

YOUTH IN TRANSITION

(Entering Grades 9-12)

Time: 8:00a.m. - 1:00p.m. (4 Period Class)

For youth in high school special education. These two sessions will help prepare students for success in the workplace by working on independent living skills including social interaction, managing money, and taking care of yourself. Using hands-on activities and instruction, the class will guide students towards being able to have positive interactions at work, problem solving, and fitting into a work environment.

HIGH SCHOOL COURSES

Menomonie High School virtual courses are offered during the summer for students entering grades 9-12. Please contact the high school guidance department 715-232-2606, ext. 40137 to sign up for one of these amazing opportunities!

9TH GRADE ALGEBRA

(Entering 9th Grade)

Menomonie High School is offering a summer Algebra I course. The course will run for nine weeks. This course will cover the same learning targets as the Algebra I course being offered during the academic school year at MHS. If you are planning on pursuing advanced courses in STEM related fields and will need to complete higher levels of math and science before MHS graduation, this is a great way to start your path. The course will utilize online instruction. **Teacher recommendation is required for course registration.**

AP PHYSICS - ONLINE

The course is offered to students enrolled in AP Physics for the 2024-2025 school year. This recommended summer project will be online and begin the Advanced Placement Physics curriculum. Students completing the course will earn .25 credits.

AP STATISTICS - ONLINE

The course is offered to students enrolled in AP Statistics for the 2024-2025 school year. The goal of this course is to review the skills and content related to probability and statistics learned in Algebra I, Geometry, and Algebra II to help prepare you for the AP Stats class in the Fall. Students completing the course will earn .25 credits.



CERTIFIED NURSING ASSISTANT (CNA) - ONLINE

(Entering Grades 11-12)

CVTC along with Menomonie School District have partnered to offer incoming high school juniors and seniors who are at least 16 years old, and who are interested in pursuing a career in health care, an opportunity to earn high school and college credit through a CNA course. This 120-hour course is a combination of lecture, lab and clinical practice, ethical, and legal considerations. This course is recognized by the Wisconsin Department of Health Services as a nursing assistant training program. A criminal background check is required at the start of the class. Students must complete an application for consideration to take this course through the Counseling Office. Students accepted into this course will obtain dual credit through our CNA Academy and CVTC. Dual credit academies give high school students the chance to navigate their interests and career options to develop the most successful individualized career path.

Credits earned through this academy may be applied towards CVTC's technical degree programs. By completing this course and passing the WI State CNA exam, students will have the credentials to work as a Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA). Applications are taken online only at <https://tinyurl.com/yb45n6vn>. Applicants will be interviewed and selected by staff based on a prioritized rubric for this session, as seats are limited.

CIVICS - ONLINE

(Entering Grades 11-12)

Civics is designed to give students an understanding of citizenship and prepare them to engage as responsible citizens. Students will learn the rights and responsibilities associated with living in our democracy. The course will foster knowledge of the working of a local, state, and national governments. Students will take the required State Citizenship Test for graduation. The test will be taken onsite and the date will be scheduled by the instructor. Students completing the course will earn .5 credits.

HEALTH - ONLINE

(Entering Grade 9)

Maximum Enrollment: 50

The personal, social, and physical needs of health are covered with units in disease prevention, mental health, emotional health, nutrition, human growth and development personal health, alcohol, tobacco, and other drug awareness. Students completing the course will earn .5 credits.

PERSONAL FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT - ONLINE

(Entering Grades 11-12)

Students are prepared for successful management of their personal finances while understanding the responsibility to the broader community. Students will learn the relationship between education, income, career, desired lifestyle, and will develop the planning skills needed to achieve their financial goals. Course concepts are personal money management strategies, including how to plan, develop, use and maintain a personal budget, building and using personal wealth, credit and debit management, financial goals, saving and investing; consumer rights and responsibilities, laws and consumer protection organizations; and risk management including the role of insurance as a critical part of personal financial planning. Students completing the course will earn .5 credits.

PERSONAL FITNESS (PE) - ONLINE

(Entering Grades 10, 11, 12)

Maximum Enrollment: 50

Online Physical Education allows students to extend their learning of lifetime fitness outside of the school setting. The course promotes a keen understanding of the value of physical fitness and aims to motivate students to participate in physical activities throughout their lives. Specific areas of study will include: Components of Physical Fitness (Cardiovascular endurance, muscular strength and endurance, and Body Composition) goal setting, nutrition, and stress management. Students will use a heart rate monitor (FitBit, Polar, Garmin, etc.) to track their physical activity. Students should expect to engage in moderate to vigorous physical activity for 45 minutes per day on four days of the week in the summer. Students will be required to perform a pre, mid, and post fitness test with their instructor. Instructional Methods/Assessment: Instruction will be delivered through an online environment utilizing readings, videos, and online discussions. Assessments include online discussions, quizzes, research papers, worksheets, journaling, written exam, and daily physical activity. Successful completion of this course will require a parent/legal guardian sign-off on student selected physical activities, and on weekly participation reports to verify the student is meeting his or her requirements and responsibilities. By the end of the course, students will have gained the knowledge needed to begin developing healthy habits that will last a lifetime. Students completing the course will earn .5 credits.

HIGH SCHOOL REMEDIAL COURSES

High School students who have failed one or more required courses for graduation are expected to enroll in a remedial course to make up coursework they failed to complete during the school year. The following are offerings that will be provided at the high school level. Students may complete two courses during the six weeks of summer provided they have already participated in one of these classes and received a failing grade. **Parents will be notified by the high school guidance office if their child will need to enroll in these courses.**

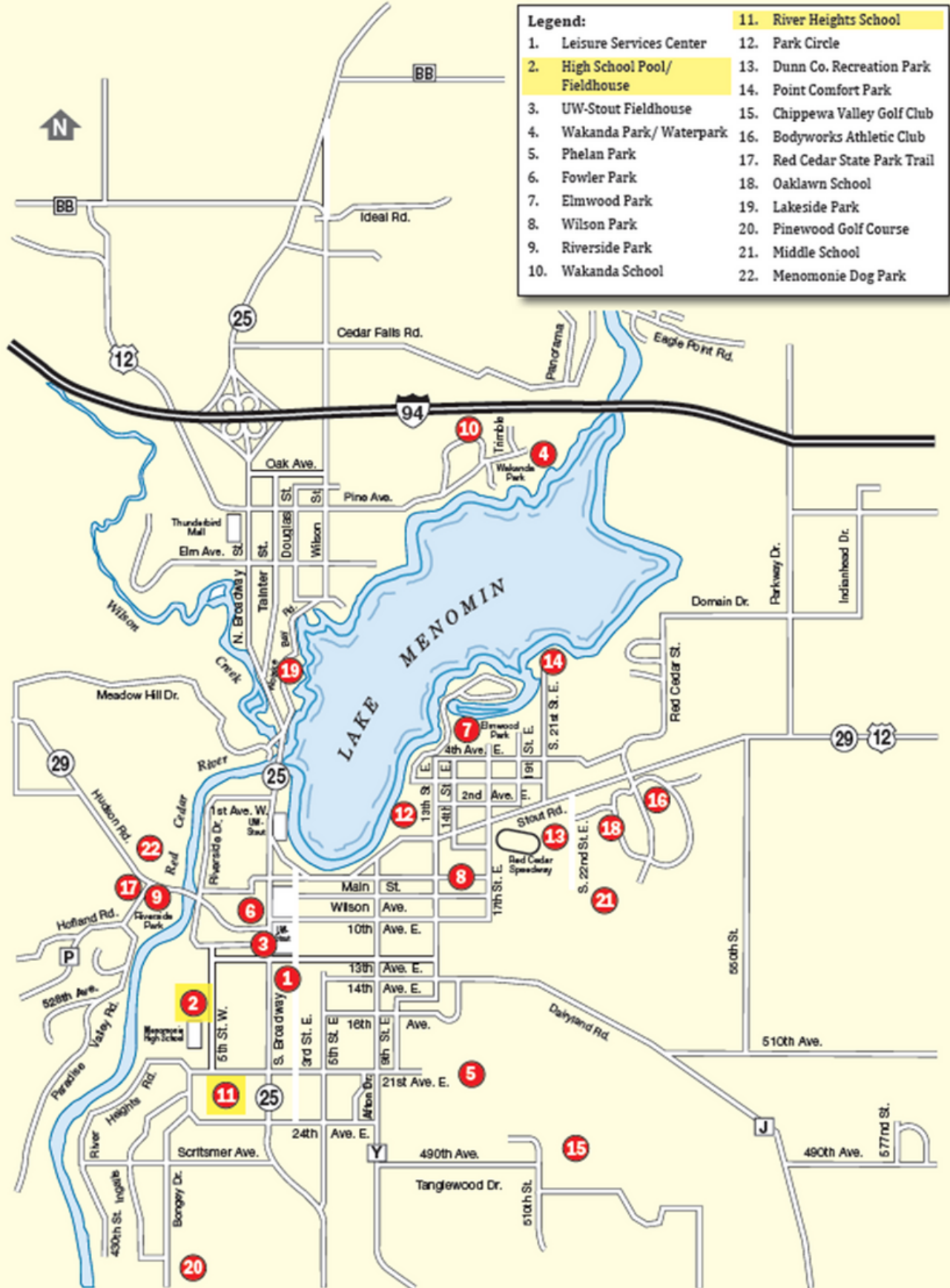
